## **Empanada**

### **Ingredients**


- 1 tablespoon canola oil, divided
- 1 pound ground chuck
- 1 cup chopped white onion (from 1 small onion)
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic (from 1 garlic clove)
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons taco seasoning mix
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 4 (8- to 10-in.) flour tortillas
- 8 ounces quesadilla cheese or white

Cheddar cheese, shredded (about 2 cups)

Sour cream

Guacamole

Salsa



Sprinkle each tortilla evenly with 1/2 cup cheese, and top each with 3/4 cup meat mixture: fold tortillas in half. Heat 1 teaspoon of the oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium; add 2 quesadillas, and cook until golden brown and crisp, 1 to 2 minutes. Using a spatula, turn quesadillas over, and cook one more minute. Transfer hot quesadillas to a baking sheet and keep warm in preheated oven. Repeat with remaining 1 teaspoon oil and 2 quesadillas. Serve with sour cream, guacamole, and salsa.
