This is week 3 of Science (out of 5*this has changed!) in Quarter 3. This week we will learn about Newton's Laws of Motion

Math Reminders/Procedures:

-Please review multiplication facts. 5-10 minutes nightly reviewing facts as well as factors vs. multiples would benefit all students. We are beginning division, and it is **CRITICAL** that multiplication facts are mastered.

-Please remind students to arrive at class on time with all necessary materials. Ask your student what may need to be replenished- dry erase markers, pencils (no mechanical pencils), cap erasers etc. A conduct mark will be issued to students without supplies. Students may not use a pen on any assignments in math class. Points will be deducted if a pen is used.
