Parents,

Graded papers will be sent home next week in your child's red folder. Be sure to take out the graded work and look over it. The SCS policy requires grades for classwork, participation, assessments, homework, and presentation/projects.

Classwork and assessments will have a numerical grade with the corresponding letter grade. Participation, homework, and projects receive just the letter grade.

Students will have homework grades as required by the district. Make sure your child reads the fluency page at least 3 times each week to receive full credit for reading homework. Your child should also complete 3 tasks from the math choice board each week to receive full credit for math homework.
