

Medical District High School Enrollment FAQ's

Who is eligible?

Any student that has been promoted to 9th grade may apply through the Shelby County Schools Choice Process. Students will be interviewed to determine if they have the skills and determination to be successful in this full honors-level curriculum for high performing students.

How do I apply for Medical District High School?

Guidelines are outlined on the "Apply" button located on the school webpage and the Shelby County Schools "CHOICE" webpage. Upon application submission, students and their parents/guardians will be invited for an interview. After the interview process, students and their parents/guardians will be notified of enrollment status. If accepted, students will receive information about the mandatory orientation.

Will there be bus transportation?

Shelby County Schools will not provide transportation. Medical District High School will provide cards for public transportation upon request.

What type of classes will 9th and 10th graders take?

Enrolled students in 9th and 10th grade will take English Honors, World History/Geography, Government and Economics Honors, Math Algebra I Honors, Geometry Honors, Biology Honors, Foreign Language, Dual Enrollment PE and Wellness Perspective, and either Health Science Education or Computer Science (depending on selected academic pathway). The program is designed to have all applicable classes at the honors, Advanced Placement, or Dual Enrollment level of rigor.

*Classes listed are examples and subject to change.

What type of classes will 11th and 12th graders take?

The goal of Medical District High School is for all 11th and 12th graders to be enrolled at Southwest Tennessee Community College as full-time college students, taking dual enrollment classes. All core and elective courses in 11th and 12th grade are selected with consideration of earning an Associate's Degree and satisfying high school graduation requirements. Exceptions will be made if credits are needed to be retrieved.

How do I know what classes to take?

High school guidance counselors will manage course selection to track student progress towards graduation. Southwest Tennessee Community College with the support of high school advising personnel will manage and track college classes. HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS ARE THE PRIORITY.
