Parent-Teacher Conferences


Parent-teacher conferences are an integral part of maintaining communication between home and school.

Teacher Qualifications

Parents have the right to know a teacher's professional qualifications, which includes: state qualifications, licensure, grade/s certification, waivers.

• Timely notification that their child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified

• They have an option to request a transfer to another school within the district if their child is the victim of a violent crime at school


I support this form of parental involvement. Therefore, I will strive to do the following:
