

Lucie E. Campbell Elementary School's FAQ

Q: What time does school begin and end:

A: School begins at 8:15am and ends at 3:15pm.

Q: How many students will be allowed in each classroom?

A: In person classes will not exceed 15 students per class to the extent possible. Virtual classes will have the normal number of students per class (KK-3rd Grade about 20 students, 4th & 5th about 25 students)

Q: How will instruction be delivered for scholars returning to in-person learning?

A: Scholars will receive high quality instruction in the same manner as virtual scholars, via Microsoft TEAMS.

Q: For virtual learning, will students be able to pick up physical workbooks, or will all work be 100% through canvas?

A: Students attending in person and virtually will receive workbooks and other physical materials to supplement their learning.

Q: Are mask a requirement for scholars returning in-person?

A: ALL students and staff will be required to wear a mask, appropriately fitted over the nose and mouth, at all times throughout the day, including the school bus. Students will be allowed to uncover mouths only when eating breakfast/lunch and taking a drink of water or milk. This safety measure will be strictly enforced.

Q: What are student expectations for social distancing?

A: ALL students will be socially distanced to the extent possible and whenever possible. To reduce the number of transitions, all students will remain in cohort classes the entire day. Students will have breakfast and lunch in the classrooms. Please remember that this plan can change based on number of students attending and any changes sent by the District. Each class will have scheduled restroom breaks to reduce student interaction.

Q: What instructional materials should students bring to school daily for in-person learning:

A: Laptops/Chargers/Headphones: Students will be required to bring their FULLY charged laptop to school every day. ALL learning will still be delivered and

completed using the device and the TEAMS platform. Students will also be required to bring their chargers every day, as we know the devices cannot make it through a full day without being recharged. Students may bring their own, appropriate, headphones to class, as headphones will be required for learning. LEC will have headphones available for all in-person students.

Q: Are uniforms required for the remainder of the 2020-21 school year?

A: Uniforms are required for scholars attending in-person learning at LEC. Scholars who remain virtual are not required to wear school uniforms.

Q: Can in-person scholars bring their own lunch to school?

A: Outside lunches are permitted. However, scholars will not be permitted to share food. It is advised that scholars bring a healthy lunch/snack to school. Students will only be permitted to eat the lunch during their designated lunch time (NO EXCEPTIONS).

Q: How will scholars receive water during the school day?

A: SCS will provide one water bottle to each child per day. However, students will be allowed to bring a CLEAR plastic water bottle to class. ONLY water may be in the water bottle. For safety, water fountains will not be used for either drinking or the refilling of water bottles.

Q: Will students with an IEP still receive the same support?

A: Students with IEPs will receive services. If students receive resource (pull out), then they will continue to do so virtually or in person. Students who receive special education services will have educational options provided by their school's IEP team. The Department of Exceptional Children and Health Services launched a new hotline – 901-416-5206 – to help families with questions about special education services and the fall learning options. You can call M-F this week, 9am-4pm.

Q: For the temperature check in the morning will parents need to stay put until their child's temperature is taken or no?

A: Parents should wait in vehicles until their student has been screened before pulling off. Parents should never simply drop students off at Lucie E. Campbell and leave. Parents should also be sure to keep students at home who may be symptomatic.

Q: Will parents who choose in-person learning be able to access TEAMS to submit in-person learning assignments such as homework or projects?

A: Yes, all parents and students will have access to TEAMS as all instruction will continue through Microsoft TEAMS.

Q: Will Pre-K and kindergarten still have staggered entry?

A: Pre-K and Kindergarten scholars slated to return in person will not have staggered entry. All scholars will begin on March 1st.

Q: How do we help students who need to use manipulatives to aid in the learning? Is there supplies that would be available to provide students especially math?

A: The school will do our best to provide all students with manipulatives that they can take home to assist in their learning. Parents will have to come by the school to pick up these materials

Q: How would support work for kids doing Virtual Learning?

A: Support classes will operate similarly to other core classes. Students will be given a schedule and on that schedule it will specify what time support times will occur. At the specified times, students will log into the Support teachers' virtual classrooms for class.

Q: If a parent tests positive and assuming they will keep the children at home, will the student have access to virtual classes during quarantine?

A: Students who have been exposed, and are on the mandatory 14-day quarantine will have access to virtual materials while they are out.

Q: What do we do if we want to change our selection?

A: Parents can change their selection by emailing davist6@scsk12.org and/or contact the school at (901) 416-1000. Parents will need the student's PowerSchool student number and provide answers to security questions to verify their identity.

Q: Are we going to have more Service Master staff to keep the building clean thru out the day?

A: All classrooms and buildings will undergo a systematic and thorough cleaning nightly. Common areas (Entryway, Cafeteria, Classrooms, Hallways, Library, Office Areas, and Teacher Work Areas) are to be cleaned and disinfected a minimum of 2x's a day (during lunch & end of the day). Restrooms are to be cleaned and disinfected a minimum of 4x's a day ((2x's during am hours, 1 x during pm hours, & the end of shift). Since some students will be taught virtually and others in-person,

the Service Masters employees will have less classrooms to focus on, which will allow them to continually clean the building.

Q: What will be the procedures that Before and After Care will follow to ensure the safety of our students?

A: The procedures for Before and After Care will be the same for in-person instruction. Students will must be socially/physically distant, wear face masks, consistently wash their hands, and the areas of operation will be consistently cleaned. Before Care begins at 6am and After Care ends at 6pm daily. Parents will not be allowed in the building and scholars will still undergo the same safety procedures for building entry.

Q: What is a good time to get your kids to school to start on time? Because of temp. check will take up more time.

A: Parents should plan to arrive at Lucie E. Campbell between 7:50 am 8:00 am. No early drop-offs will be permitted.

Q: What are the specific times for dismissal?

A: LEC will conduct staggered dismissal for scholars in grades K-5. Car riders will be dismissed at 3pm, bus riders will be dismissed beginning at 3:05pm and Walkers will be dismissed at 3:10pm. Social distance will be enforced during dismissal groups.

Q: If a student's device is broken during in-person learning, are parents still responsible for the cost?

A: Yes. Parents are responsible for the cost of a student's device if it is damaged during in-person learning.
