

Book Project: Scrapbooking

Materials: Book (fiction, student choice), drawing paper, crayons/markers

Purpose: People who create scrapbooks want to preserve fond memories of family, friends, and places they have visited. Just like in life, there are certain moments in a book that are important or stand out to a reader, due to a connection to the text.

Project: Choose a fiction book and create a scrapbook that displays the scenes of the book that are memorable. Capture the moments by drawing a picture of different scenes to preserve the memory of the book in your mind.

While you read: Make connections to the text. Try to think of something that has happened in your life that reminds you of what you read in the book. Be sure to write the connection down so you don't forget.

After you read:

- Draw at least 5 pictures to help you illustrate the story, be sure to add the title of the book and the author's name. Choose scenes that you have made connections to, or scenes that you feel are important to the story.
- Write captions for each picture. Tell what is happening in the story and why it is important to the story. Be sure to be descriptive.
