All submissions must be received by **Friday, February 21, 2020 at 5 p.m. CST.** Entrants may write in their primary language as long as an interpretive English translation is also attached. Use of copyrighted material is prohibited. Essays will be judged based on content, organization and originality. The top three winning essays, determined on the basis set forth in the judging criteria section, may be included in print or online in support of African American Male Empowerment activities. 20 entries will be awarded, and three grand prizes. **Winners will be announced at a special ceremony on February 27, 2020.**
