Therefore, it is important to A) <u>actually read the book you select</u> and B) complete the written assignment with fidelity and to the best of your ability. This is the groundwork for a presentation!

After reading the book you select from the list above, complete the following assignment:

- 1. **Research the author**. Address in no more than 150 words relevant information about the author's background and credibility in producing their book.
- 2. What perspective on the overall unit topic does this source address? Choose ONE perspective from the list below. Then explain how the book encompasses that perspective in no more than 300 words total. Utilize 2 short quotes (5-8 words long) from throughout the book to support the perspective you choose.
 - o Cultural/Social
 - Artistic/Philosophical
 - o Ethical
 - o Political/Historical
 - o Scientific
 - Environmental
 - o Economic
- 3. What is the author's overall argument in this book? Explain their argument completely yet concisely in no more than 100 words.
- 4. How did this book enhance your understanding of the overall unit topic? Answer in no more than 300 words. Consider questions like:
 - What did you already know about the unit topic? What new information did this book contribute to your prior understanding?
 - What information in the book surprised you or stood out to you?
 - What questions do you have after reading this book? What else do you want to learn?

Your assignment should be typed in a Microsoft Word document and emailed to youngm4@scsk12.org. Please follow the formatting guidelines listed below. There is also an example assignment, which will help you adhere to the formatting guidelines. This assignment is due to my email by 11:59 pm on 8/11, the first Friday of the week we return to school.

- Title your document: FirstName.LastName.APSeminar.SummerAssignment
- Save your document as a .doc, .docx, or .pdf when you are finished. If I cannot open the attachment, it gets a zero.
- The document should be 1.5 spaced, size 12 font, in Times New Roman or Calibri, with standard 1 inch margins.
- The heading should include your name, the date, and the class name and "Summer Assignment" and should be justified to the left.
- Type the title and author and then answer the questions below the title and author
- Answer each question within the given word limit. Include the word limit beneath each question you answer.
- See the attached example to format your work properly.
