- Inform parents on student progress with various assessments
- Provide guidance on how to read data reports
- Provide recommendations on how to assist students



District Assessments & Intervention

EDGENUITY

- Edgenuity MyPath includes two computer-based placement assessments (one for reading and one math) that will be used to recommend an ILP based on each student's performance.
- The MyPath assessment is used as a diagnostic screening tool to identify students who may need additional academic support and monitor student growth.
- In addition, MyPath can help teachers determine appropriate instructional areas and skills to focus on during small group intervention instruction.

ILLUMINATE/FASTBRIDGE

- Illuminate/FastBridge is the newly selected RTI² assessment platform for students in grades K-8 and will replace easyCBM in the 2020-2021 school year.
- Illuminate Education can be used in both special education and regular education in order to meet the state guidelines related to effective implementation of RTI².
- Illuminate Education provides in-depth information on students' strengths and areas of need for specific skills in reading and math.
- The goal of the process is to monitor student progress as the student receives intervention with the expectation that the intervention will result in the student achieving at high levels of learning while closing the achievement gap among same-age peers.

MASTERY CONNECT

- Grades K-12 will participate in standards-based assessments aligned with district ELA, math, and science curriculum maps.
- Mastery Connect is an assessment platform that allows teachers to assess student mastery of specific standards.
- Students can receive results instantly.
- The results are displayed by standard, so although students will still get an overall percentage on any assessment taken, the focus is on the mastery of the specific standards.

CIVICS EXAM

- All 12th graders will take the Civics Exam.
- The exam is made up of 52 multiple choice questions based on the Naturalization Test.
- The test will be housed in Mastery Connect.

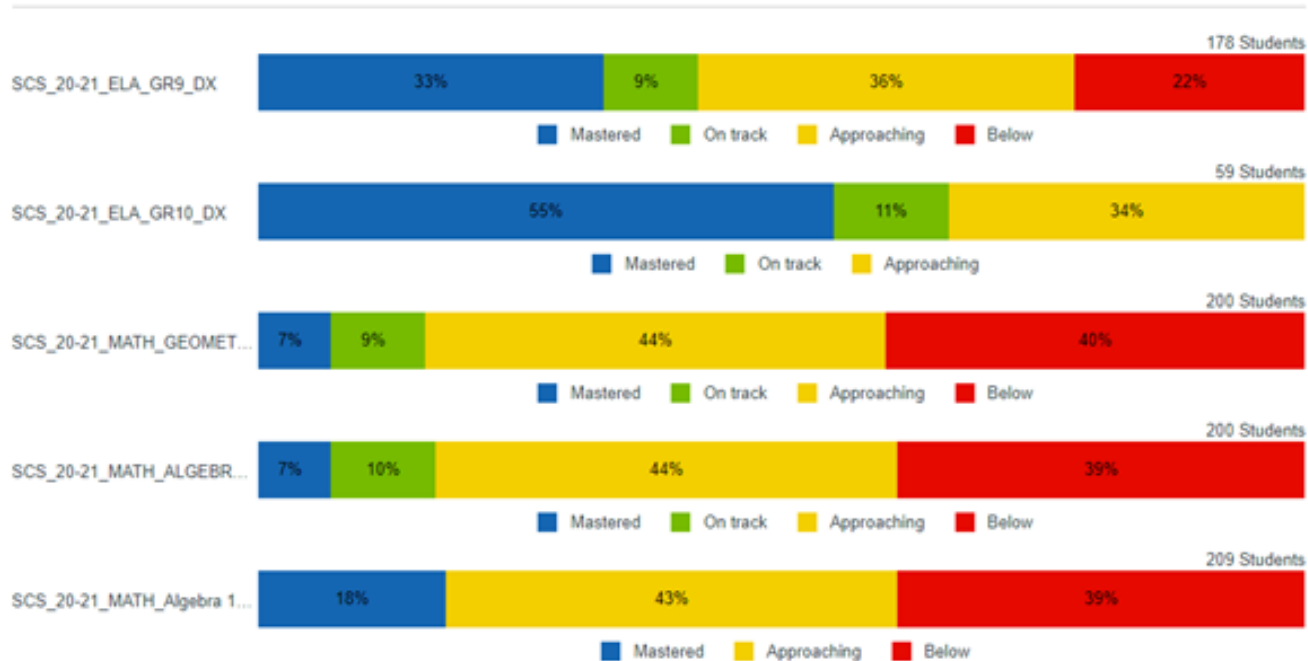
COLLEGE AND CAREER READY
