What is Title I?



The largest federal aid program for our nation's schools.

 The goal of Title 1 is to ensure a high-quality education for every child by providing funding in order to close the educational gap.

Serves millions of children.







Funding Source



- The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I.
- The State Education Agency sends the money to the Local Education Agencies (districts) based on the number of low-income families within the district.
 - The LEA identifies schools in their district with the highest percentage of children from low-income families and provides those schools with Title I resources.



- Additional teachers and assistants
- Additional training of school staff
- Extra time for instruction (extended learning)

The School Improvement Plan is updated yearly with parent and community input to meet the needs of the students at Germantown and is available to all parents through the school website.






Reporting Student Progress

Germantown Elementary School Family Engagement Policy

The family engagement policy was jointly developed with parents to establish the expectation for parental involvement. This plan contains details to carry out the Shelby County School's Family Engagement Policy #4.502. A copy of this plan will be distributed to all parents in the school, the community, and posted on the school's website.

At Germantown Optional School, we want each student to have a successful learning experience. Because the students and parents are top priority, it is important that the school staff, community, and parents work together.

To build a strong relationship between home, community, and school, Germantown Optional Elementary will provide the following:

- Convene two Annual Title I meetings (AM and PM times) where all parents are informed about Title I requirements, school participation, their right to be involved, the parents' right to know, and volunteer opportunities.
- Convene a flexible number of parent meetings with flexible times available, (morning, afternoon, and evening) which allow an organized, ongoing and timely way where parents are familiarized with the curriculum, given tips to assist their child at home, discuss the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, (report cards, Achieve 3000, I-Ready, Formative Assessment, Common Assessment STAR Reading) discuss the importance of weekly communication between the teacher and parent by using the Wednesday Folders, and inform parents of the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
- Provide timely information about parent programs
- Hold parent conferences where the progress of the student will be discussed and explained (and discuss the parent-school compact as needed.)
- Provide opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions, to participate in decisions
 relating to the education of their <u>children, and</u> respond to any suggestions as soon as practicably
 possible.
- Update the school website which outlines school programs, parenting programs, and events.
- Meet with leadership council to review, plan, and make suggestions to improve the current Family Engagement Plan/Policy and parent-school compact. (Both jointly developed with parents)
- Provide a description and explanation of curriculum, academic assessment, and proficiency levels.
- Parent training in technology, how to assist their child with homework, and other academic areas
 Convene an annual ELL parent meeting where all ELL parents will be given information on assisting their children in attaining English proficiency and in achieving academic success
- Provide training for teachers, parents, and the other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate
 with, and work with parents as equal partners
- Provide opportunities for you to get involved and share the responsibility of promoting success in our children.

Every effort will be made to communicate with parents in an understandable format and language. Parents are encouraged to take an active role in school improvement. By making suggestions to improve our school, we can make a difference at Germantown Optional Elementary School.



What is RTI2?

- Response to Instruction & Intervention
- Supports student academic growth by allowing them to receive additional, specialized instruction in specific areas of Math and Reading.
- School district initiative to ensure that students are college and career ready upon graduation







Key Components of RTI2

- High quality curriculum and instruction in your child's general education classroom (Tier 1)
- Universal screening to determine performance and progress that will identify who needs help
- Intervention to match your child's area of need in reading or mathematics (Tier 2 and Tier 3)

- Progress monitoring to determine your child's success
- Parents receive monthly reports on their child's progress monitoring results, goals and best practices to help at home
