All students can learn and will achieve academic success with highly qualified, educated, and caring educators and administrators.

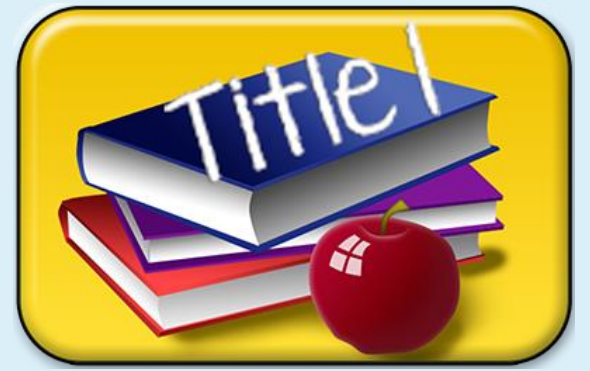
Instructional planning must be data driven, realistic, aligned with the district and state standards, and continuously evaluated to ensure student learning and achievement.

Assessment and evaluation techniques must be varied, research-based, and continually evaluated to support instructional modifications and promote individual student progress.

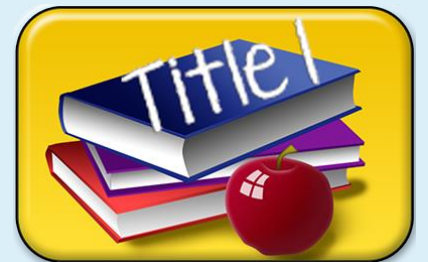
WHAT IS TITLE I?



- ❑ Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- ❑ The goal of Title I is to provide a higher quality of education for every child. Its purpose is to address the academic needs of students in order to assist them in achieving Tennessee Academic Standards.
- ❑ The program serves millions of children in public elementary and secondary schools each year including eligible students in private schools.

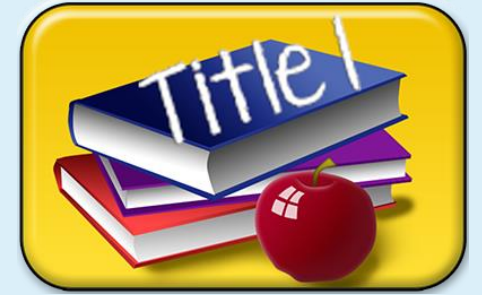
TITLE I FUNDING OVERVIEW

- ❑ The federal government provides funding to states each year for the Title I program.
- ❑ The Tennessee Department of Education allocates the money to our district.
- ❑ The school district identifies eligible schools and distributes the Title I funds to the school.
- ❑ Colonial Middle implements a school wide program, in which all students benefit from the supplemental services provided by Title I.

**Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
Parents' Right-To-Know**

All parents have the right to request the following:

- A teacher's professional qualifications, which includes: state qualifications, licensure, grade/s certification, waivers
- A teacher's baccalaureate and /or graduate degree, fields of endorsement, previous teaching experience
- A paraprofessional's qualifications
- An assurance that their child's name, address, and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters

All parents will receive information on the following:

- Their child's level of achievement in each of the state academic assessments
- Their option to request a transfer to another school within the district if their child is the victim of a violent crime at school
- Their right to timely notification that their child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who is not highly qualified

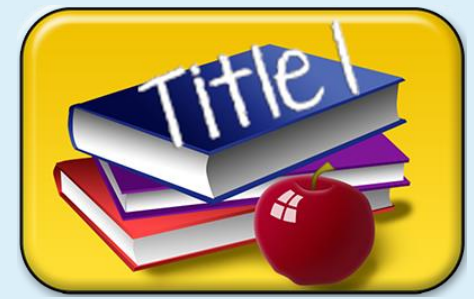
Todos los padres tienen derecho a solicitar lo siguiente:

- Su opción de solicitar un traslado a otra escuela del distrito si su hijo/a es víctima de un crimen violento en la escuela
- Su derecho a aviso con tiempo anticipado que su hijo/a ha sido asignado o ha estado bajo la enseñanza durante cuatro semanas consecutivas o más, de un maestro que no está altamente cualificado

PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW

- ☐ Know your child's level of achievement on assessments in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science.
- ☐ Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher and educational support professionals that are working with your child.
- ☐ Know if your child is taught by a non-highly qualified teacher for four or more consecutive weeks.

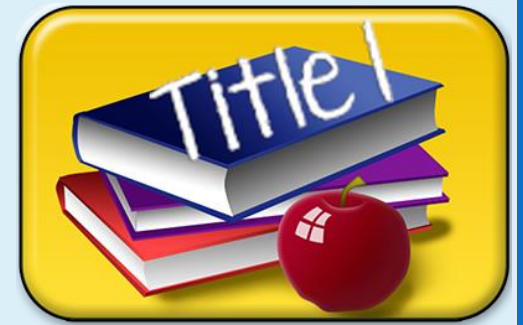

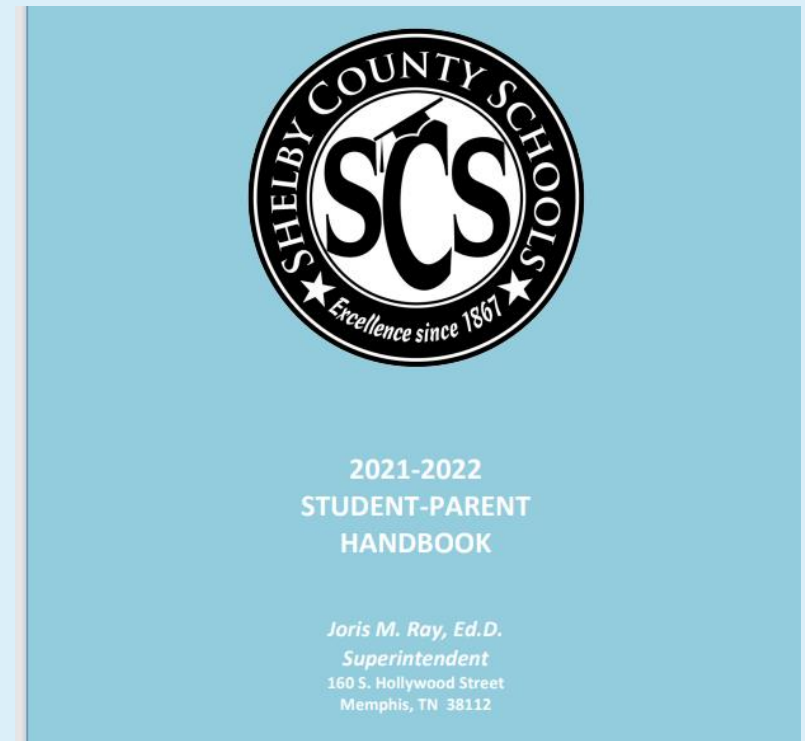

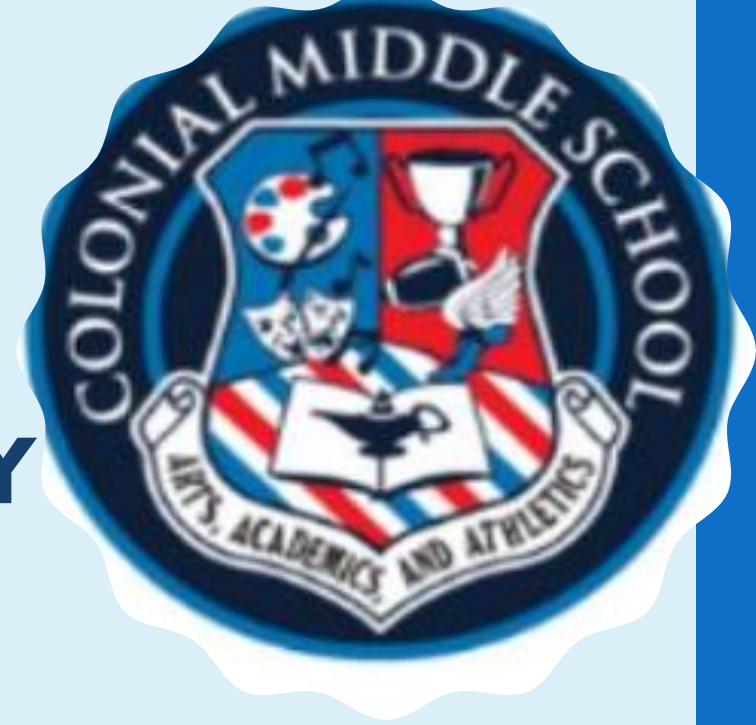
