## **AP Seminar: Summer 2025 Assignment**

Next year, we will complete three units of study during the first semester. Unit 1 will address the role of technology in K12 education, and your summer reading is aligned to our Unit 1 focus.

#### **Additional Information about AP Seminar:**

**AP** Capstone: Remember, AP Seminar is the first course in a two-year sequence, known as AP Capstone. Since you are taking AP Seminar during your junior year, you will also take AP Research in your senior year. Taking both courses is a requirement.

**Technology Access:** All papers and presentations will be done digitally in AP Seminar. Students are required to have a school-issued laptop or other laptop/padlet device each day in class.

The Role of Generative AI: In AP Seminar, your work will be run through TurnItIn.com, which includes an AI checker. Students are expected to authentically engage with sources by reading them on their own, without the use of generative AI. Students are also expected to write authentically, without the use of generative AI creating information for them or changing the structure or tone of their writing. Using generative AI tools, like ChatGPT and others, for these reasons is prohibited.

**First Semester Readings:** For your knowledge and preparation, I am also listing the books we will read for the subsequent two units. Before Units 2 & 3, you will also have to read a book, selected from the list below. Therefore, over the summer, you may want to get a head start on <u>ONE</u> reading from <u>EACH</u> of the two units below. AP Seminar is a reading and writing intensive course, so it would be to your benefit to select and read the books below over the summer. Nevertheless, reading these books over the summer is not required and reading the selections below will be built into the semester schedule.
