DID YOU KNOW???? MCHS REMINDERS

- Students are only allowed to have food brought from home or from the cafeteria. Parents may drop off food in normal lunch bags/boxes for students during their lunchtime only. No outside food or drink may be consumed because our lunch is federally funded. Students also are not allowed to order food to be delivered. Seniors will have specific privileges in the FUTURE, but currently, this rule is for all students.
- Cell phones are not allowed to be out and visible during class or when students are in study hall. Students will receive infractions and additional consequences if they abuse this policy.
- Hoodies are only allowed if they are MCHS Luminary hoodies. Students wearing hoodies will be given one reminder before receiving an infraction.
- School starts at 8:15 am when the tardy bell rings. Students must be on time and present each school day. Late arrivals and early dismissals count against the student's seat time, which affects their overall attendance. At MCHS, a choice school, students are allowed NO MORE than ten unexcused absences and tardies for the entire school year.
- In order for students to participate in extracurricular and sports, they must remain in good academic standing, passing all courses. Students' grades will be reviewed at the progress reporting period, September 8th, and students who are not making progress will become ineligible to participate at the end of Q1.

Saturday School

We recently completed our 1st cycle of Saturday school. The purpose of Saturday school is to provide students with the necessary supports to stay on top of their work, as well as provide study space for students who wish to engage in peer tutoring or study groups.

Our next cycle of Saturday school begins on **September 18th** and will last for three weeks. Students will be selected for mandatory intervention if they are identified by a teacher based on their progress up to our progress reporting period, September 8th, and students who are behind pacing in SAILS, Memphis Virtual School courses online, and AP Access for All online courses.

Saturday school intervention is **mandatory** to help students remain eligible for extracurriculars and to remain in good standing with MCHS. Students who work should ensure their grades remain in good standing; weekend jobs are not an excuse for students to miss Saturday school. For the next Saturday cycle, parents will be informed on **September 9th** after progress reports are distributed on September 8th.




A limited amount of students will be allowed to voluntarily sign up for study space during Saturday school.
