Is your ACT right? Are you at a point to maximize scholarship money and eliminate the need for remedial coursework? Underclassmen, are you DE eligible, in order to have the largest selection of classes MCHS has to offer?!?!?

There are only THREE tests left before the school year ends. We know anything can happen, so we must be prepared!

ALL students with less than a 25 composite on the ACT, should be spending at least 1-2 hours per week using the Magoosh ACT prep program we have purchased for our students' benefit.

MCHS ACT Goals 2020-2021

- 90% of the class of 2021 will be Ready Graduates (21 or higher on ACT)
- 100% of the class of 2022 will be Dual Enrollment eligible before the beginning of 2021 school year (19 or higher on ACT)
- FIVE more students will have a 30 composite or higher on the ACT
- All 9th and 10th graders would have taken the ACT and 50% will have a score of 19 or higher on ACT

London Stephens, Madiyson Henry and A'Maya Ramsey




