This course covers U.S. History from the Industrial Revolution (about 1870) through the 21st century. In order to prepare for the End of Year exam in May, we will need to get a head start this summer. The vast majority of the summer work involves completing a variety of map exercises. It is important that each student has a basic grasp of what America “looks” like. If you do not have strong geography skills you will struggle in this course. I should not have to explain where a particular state, region, or major body of water is located. These are basic geography skills that you should have. Not to mention, one of the fastest growing needs in the workplace are good geographic analysis skills.

Among the many activities that can depend on analysis of geospatial data are maintaining roads and other critical transportation infrastructures, quickly responding to natural disasters, such as floods, hurricanes, and fires, and tracking endangered species.”

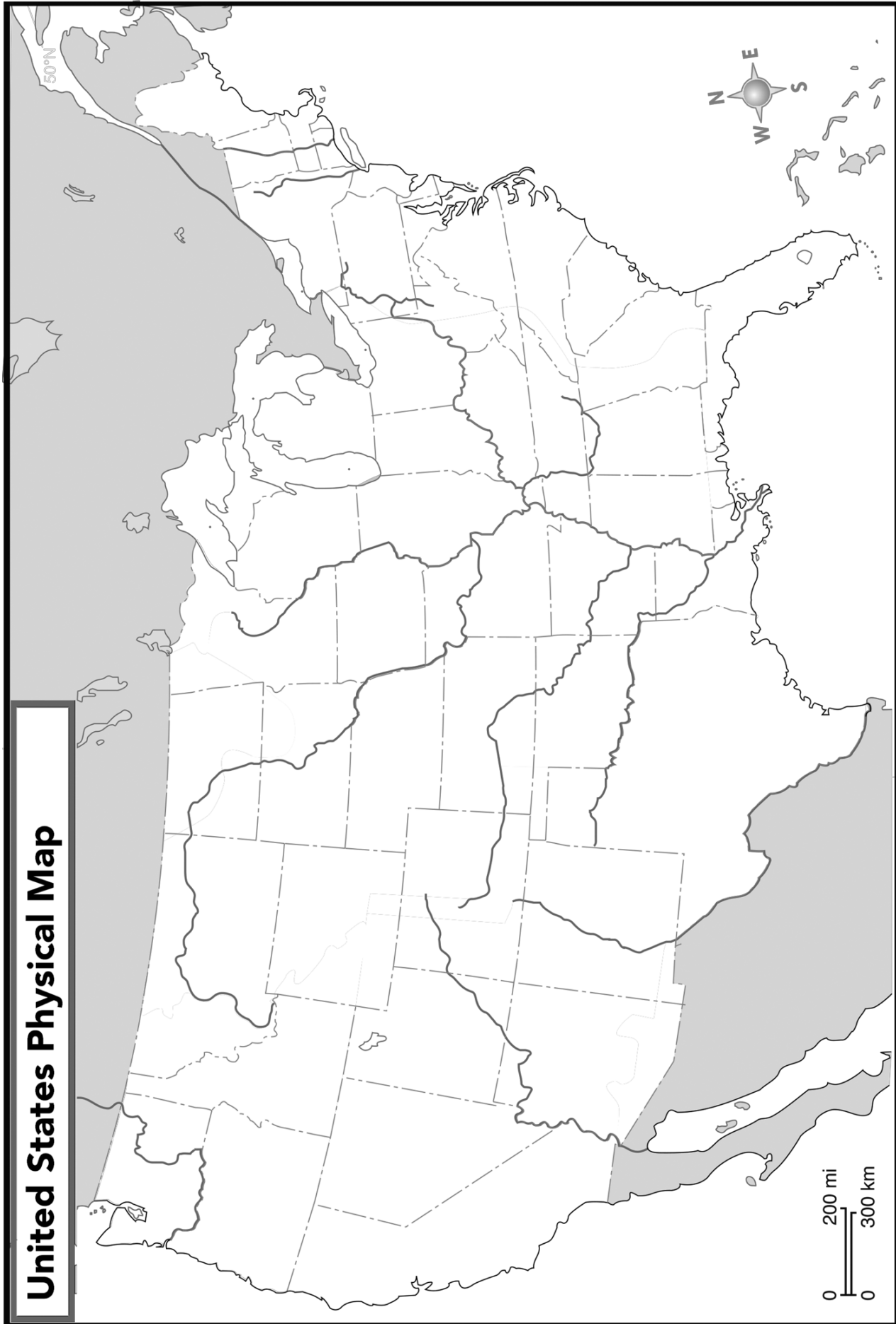

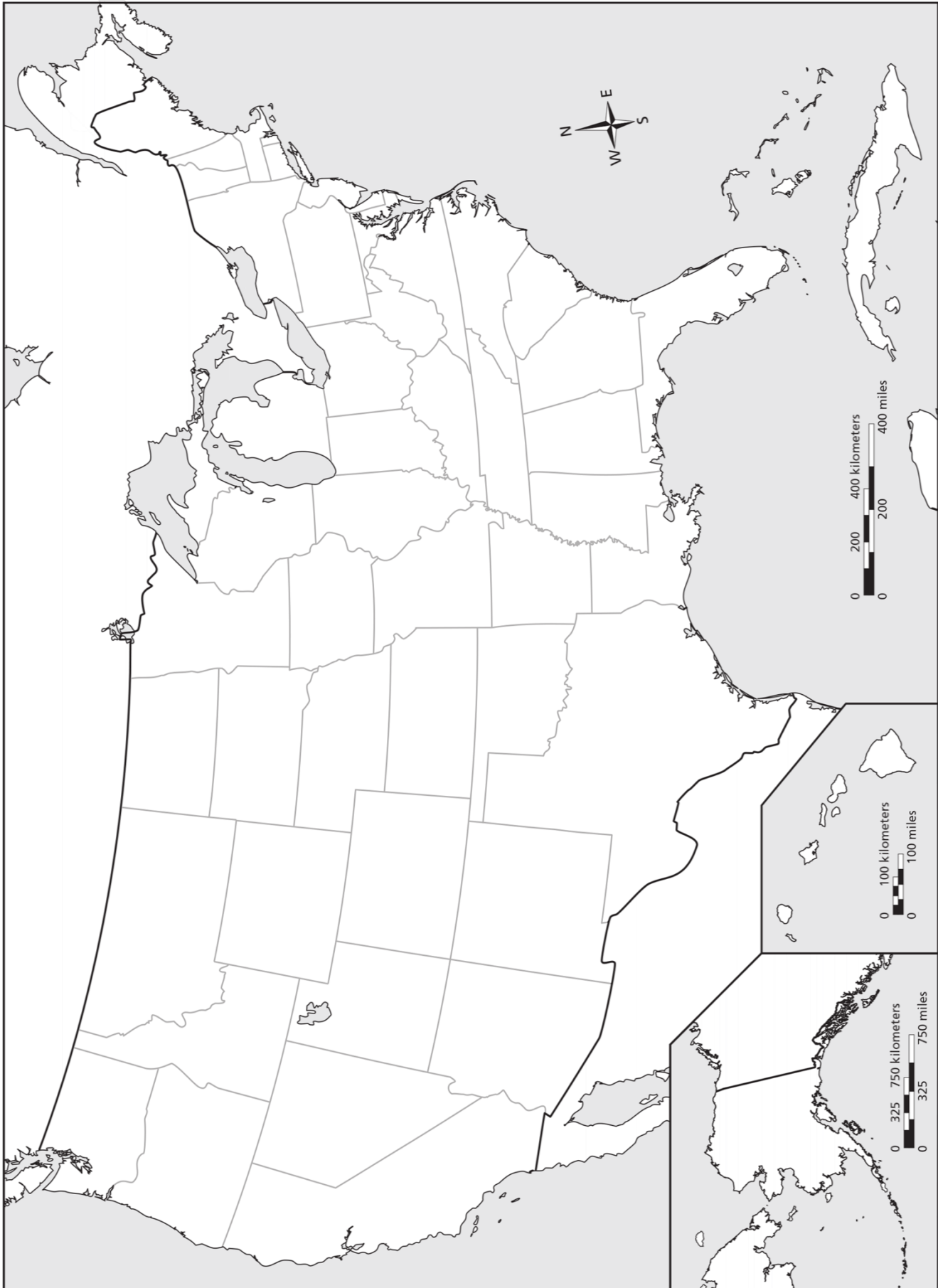
