ACADEMIC SHOWCASE



During Quarter 3, we will cover WWII and the Cold War. While teaching about WWII students will learn the rise of fascism and totalitarianism after World War I, the causes and course of World War II, and the military, economic, and political effects of the war. Students will also analyze events and changes that resulted from the post-World War II rivalry between communist and democratic governments during the Cold War.

This will be an interesting topic for students as they will learn about the rise of fascism and totalitarianism after World War I, which was a complex occurrence that emerged in several countries, including Italy, Germany, and Spain. Students will learn that fascism is a political ideology that emphasizes the importance of the state over the individual and is characterized by dictatorial power, extreme nationalism, and suppression of political opposition. Totalitarianism, on the other hand, is a form of government that seeks to control all aspects of society and the economy, including the private lives of citizens. Students will also learn about the causes of World War II, which was caused by a combination of factors.


