
The Road to College

August	Make a list of colleges that are a good fit you. 6 to 10 schools are a good number. Do your <u>research</u> .		
September	Next apply. Most colleges have an online application on their site. Or you can also use <u>Common APP</u> , Naviance , SENDEDU, <u>HBCU APP</u> , Coalition etc. There is a cost to apply. Fees range from \$25-75 dollars. Also, hope you have built a good relationship with your teachers because now is the time to ask for a recommendation.		
September	This year we are using, Naviance a web-based program. Your Naviance account will allow your counselor to send your transcript, recommendations, and other documents to the colleges on your college application list. To access Naviance, log into Clever and select the Naviance icon.		
	Note: Naviance works with Common App and other colleges, it does not take the place of an application.		
Naviance	Instructions on how to add colleges to Naviance are in your Counselor's Team.		
Connect with your counselor	If recommendations are required, turn in a résumé, personal statements & parent letter to your counselor. Your counselor is available to assist. Your <u>counselor</u> will write a recommendation, complete your school report, and send off your official transcript through Naviance. * Please allow a reasonable turn around for your counselor; 3 weeks for recommendations.		
ACT	You are responsible for your ACT or SAT score getting to the college(s).		
October	Seniors may retake the <u>ACT</u> , if necessary. Senior District Retake is in October. Studying and <u>practice</u> is the key.		
October - Jan	Complete the FAFSA. <u>FAFSA</u> opens October 1 st . Your parents must be a part of this process. Note: You and your parent will need to set up sperate FAFSA accounts.		
Nov - April	Search for <u>scholarships</u> and grants. Good sources are TN Promise, <u>TN Promise</u> deadline is Nov, 1. <u>Ned</u> <u>McWherter</u> , Questbridge, <u>Local Chapters</u> and Greek organizations, your parents' employer, school's <u>senior</u> <u>REMIND</u> and Teams etc. Eligible students will receive the <u>TN HOPE Scholarship</u> . Larger scholarships will come from the colleges' scholarship funds. Look on their websites.		
Jan - April	Wait for an award letters or emails. If you don't get what you want, reevaluate and apply to more colleges. Also consider the <u>IN Promise</u> . <u>IN Promise</u> is an opportunity to attend a <u>community</u> or <u>technical</u> college for free. <u>IN Promise</u> deadline is Nov, 1. 2022		
April - May	Turn in Scholarship Report and Final Transcript Request (more information to come). Attend graduation and have a happy life. ©
