Marian Anderson

First black member of the Metropolitan Opera Company, in 1955. Arthur Ashe

First black man to win a Wimbledon singles title, defeating Jimmy Connors in 1975.

Halle Berry

First African-American to win an Academy Award for Best Actress, in 2001 for Monster's Ball.

James Hubert (Eubie) Blake

Composed first Broadway musical written and directed by African-Americans.

Guion Bluford

First African-American astronaut to launch into space, in 1983. Gwendolyn Brooks

First black to receive a Pulitzer Prize, in 1950.
