Teacher Qualifications

- The Elementary and Secondary Education Act gives you the parents and guardians of children attending a school that receives Title I funding, the right to know the qualifications of your child's teacher(s).
- It is our intent to provide each student in Memphis Shelby County Schools with teachers and paraprofessionals that are highly qualified.
- As required by federal law, all teachers in Title I schools must have a minimum of a bachelor's degree and have demonstrated highly qualified competency in the academic subjects they teacher.
- Newly hired Paraprofessionals must also meet rigorous requirements set forth for them by the State of Tennessee, as well.



Parents Right to Know

All parents will receive information on the following:

► Their child's level of achievement on each of the state's academic assessments

- Notification of the right to transfer the child to another school in the district if the student becomes a victim of a violent crime or is assigned to an unsafe school.

All parents will receive information on the following:

- Their child's level of achievement on each of the state's academic assessments
- Their option to request a transfer the child to another school in the district if their child is the victim of a violent crime or is assigned to an unsafe school
- Their right to timely notification that their child has been assigned, or has been taught for four
 or more consecutive weeks, by a teacher who is not highly qualified

Todos los padres tienen derecho a solicitar lo siguiente:

- Licencia de calificaciones profesionales de un maestro, certificación de grado(s), exenciones
- Licenciatura y/o título de posgrado de un maestro, campos de especialización, experiencia docente previa
- Las calificaciones de un paraprofesional
- Un aviso anual de privacidad de los registros educativos de los estudiantes y un aviso para la divulgación de la información del directorio escolar
- Una garantía de que el nombre, la dirección y la lista de teléfonos de su hijo no se divulgarán a los reclutadores militares

Todos los padres recibirán información sobre lo siguiente:

- El nivel de logro de su hijo en cada una de las evaluaciones académicas del estado
- Su opción de solicitar la transferencia del niño a otra escuela en el distrito si su hijo es víctima de un crimen violento o está asignado a una escuela insegura
- Su derecho a recibir una notificación oportuna de que su hijo ha sido asignado o ha sido enseñado durante cuatro o más semanas consecutivas por un maestro que no está altamente calificado

What does it mean to be a Title I School?

Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for the following:

- Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these student's meet the State's challenging content standards.
- Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
- ► Conducting parental involvement meetings/training/activities
- ► Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers
