FEDERAL PROGRAMS

What is Title I?

Title I is a program that is funded by the Federal Government that provides extra assistance to help students meet national and state achievement standards.

PURPOSE OF TITLE I

- The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.
- All Title I schools are required to hold an Annual Title I meeting at the beginning of each school year to inform parents/guardians about Title I programs and to share how parents/guardians can become involved and participate in the Title I program.

Goals of Title I

- Increase academic achievement
- Provide direct instructional support to students
- Provide professional development for teachers
- Promote parent education and involvement

Bruce Elementary Family Engagement Plan

 - Attend scheduled parent meetings, conferences, and workshops.

TEACHER'S AGREEMENT

It is important that students achieve. Therefore, I shall strive to do the following:

- Inform parents of homework and classroom policies and procedures.
- Encourage parents to visit and/or observe their child's classroom regularly.
- Ask parent to help in school.
- Provide instruction that fosters high academic expectation and provide challenging and exciting class assignments.
- Maintain ongoing communication with parents by providing information about student progress.
- Provide meaningful homework assignments for students.
- Provide necessary assistance to parents so that they can help with the assignments.
- Encourage students and parents by providing frequent reports about student progress.
- Use special activities in the classroom to make learning enjoyable.

Parents' Right to Know

Families must be informed:

- if their child is taught for four or more weeks by a teacher who does not meet the certification requirements for the grade level or subject being taught; and
- how their child performed on state progress monitoring assessments


