Course Description:

This course prepares students for the Math secton of the ACT, focusing on reviewing foundational concepts, learning problem-solving strategies, and building test-taking confidence. Students will learn techniques for time management, calculator use and how to avoid common mistakes on the ACT.

Grading Policy:

DISTRICT REQUIRED GRADING CATEGORIES & WEIGHTS (PER NINE WEEKS)

The District believes that a sufficient number of grades should be earned and recorded to accurately reflect a student's progress. Students in grades 9-12 must be provided an opportunity to earn at least 17 grades per nine-weeks (quarter) distributed among the following categories with the following weights. With the exception of projects, portfolios, and presentations, two grades for each required category (totaling eight grades) must be earned and recorded by the interim of the nine-week period.

A 90-100

B 80-89

C 70-79

D 60-69

F 59-0

- . Homework: 10% (min. of 4 grades)
- . Class Participation: 5% (min. of 4 grades)
- . Classwork: 35% (min. of 4 grades)
- Projects/Portfolios/Presentations: 10% (min. of 1 grade)
- . Assessments: 40% (min. of 4 grades)

Note: Semester grades are determined by counting the two quarter grades as 85% and the semester examination as 15%.

SCHOOLWIDE Makeup Work Policy:

It is the **primary responsibility of students/parents** to obtain the makeup work **901**dd **2136** complete it in the allotted time to receive full credit earned without point reduction.

If a student has an **excused absence**, he/she has a total of **3 days** for each excused day to submit makeup work (beginning the day after the student returns to school).

If a student had an **unexcused absence** (including short-term suspensions), he/she has a total of **1** day for each day unexcused to submit makeup work (beginning the day after the student returns to school). The highest grade a student may receive when the absence is unexcused is a 60/D.

A student cutting class will not be allowed to complete makeup work. A student cutting class will have the opportunity to take advantage of grade repair at the end of the nine-week period.

A designated space in the room will be available for students to obtain makeup assignments. **Teachers must assign a due date for each assignment**.

Once makeup assignments are obtained, **students must sign off that the work has been received**. **LATE MAKEUP WORK WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
