- ❑ The goal of Title I is to provide a higher quality of education for every child. Its **purpose is to address the academic needs of students** to assist them in meeting their state's academic standards.
- ❑ The program **serves millions of children** in public elementary and secondary schools each year including eligible students in private schools.

TITLE I FUNDING OVERVIEW

- ❑ The federal government provides funding to states each year for the Title I program.
- ❑ The Tennessee Department of Education sends the money to our district.
- ❑ The school district identifies eligible schools and distributes the Title I funds to the school.
- ❑ Sheffield High School implements a school wide program, all students benefit from the supplemental services provided by Title I.

- Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher and paraprofessionals that are working with your child.
- Principal's Attestations
- Know if your child is taught by a non-highly qualified teacher for four or more consecutive weeks.
