Students enrolled in an End of Course class (English I, English II, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Biology, US History) will take quarterly District common formative assessments via MasteryConnect, as well as in-house three weeks assessments. Data from these assessments will be used to monitor students' progress towards mastery and being proficient on the End of Course Exams.

## Parents' Right to Know



### All parents have the right to request the following:

- A teacher's professional qualification, which includes state qualifications, grades certifications, waivers
- A teacher's baccalaureate and/or graduate degree, fields of endorsement, previous teaching experience
- A paraprofessional's qualifications
- An assurance that their child's name, address and telephone listing may not be released to military recruiters

## Parents' Right to Know



### All parents will receive information on the following:

- Their child's level of achievement in each of the state academic assessments
- Their option to request a transfer to another school within the district if their child is the victim of violent crime at school
- Their right to timely notification that their child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified

### Notice of Title I School Status



#### What Does it Mean to be a Title I School?

Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for...

- identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these students meet the state's challenging content standards
- purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
- conducting parental involvement meetings/trainings/activities
- recruiting/hiring/retaining highly qualified teachers
