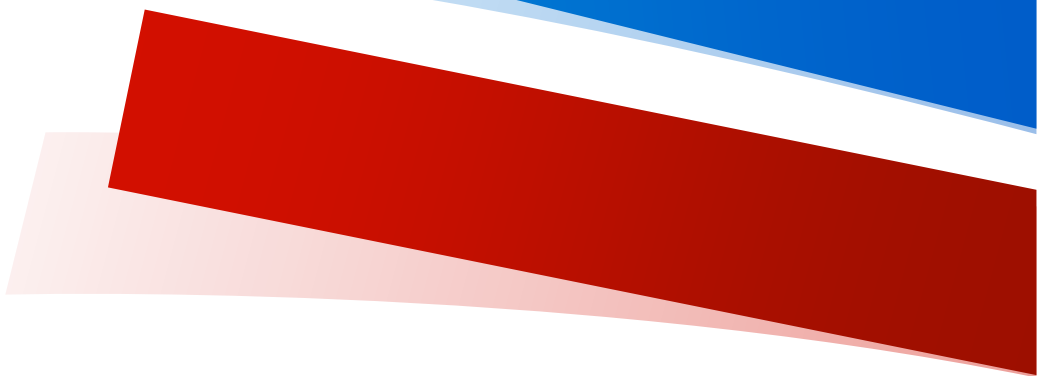



# Title 1 Requirements



Federal guidelines require Title I schools to hold an Annual Parent Meeting to explain and discuss the Title I Schoolwide program and requirements.

# The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Title I Parent and Family Engagement Requirements

- The School District and all Title I schools must develop with, and distribute to, parents and family members, a written Title I Parent and Family Engagement Plan
- All Title I schools are required to collaborate with parents and families in the development of the School Improvement Process (SIP) and School-Parent Compact.

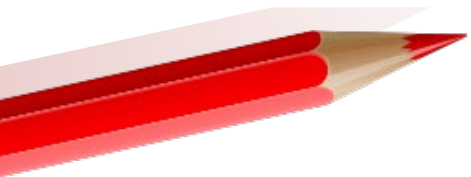
# What is Title 1?



- Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at risk of falling behind.

- Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of students eligible to receiving free/reduced lunch.

- *Riverwood Elementary School* operates a Title I School-wide Program.



- Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a school-wide program.

# Title I Funding

- Upgrade technology (e.g., computer lab)
- Provide professional learning experiences for teachers and administrators
- Parent resources and academic literature
- Instructional resources for classrooms
- Children's literature/books for the school library




# Title I Parent Notification Requirements





## Parent's Right to Know

- Non-Highly Qualified Teachers
  - Schools are required to notify parents if their child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher that is not highly qualified.


